# PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The latest Parish Council Meeting was held on Monday 6th June in the Village Hall.

A number of tasks, some of which are a legal responsibility, were undertaken this month. They included the approval of the 2021/22 Accounts, a review of the Internal Audit results, a review of financial systems in place, approval of the Accounting Statements and approval of the Governance Statements.

## **Planning**

There were no Planning Applications to discuss this month.

## **Crawley Playground and Youth Shelter**

Glass has been found on the trampoline and graffiti in the play area, which has been removed.

We are still awaiting delivery of a replacement swing.

Two parents have commented that the ramp leading up to the zip wire was too smooth and should have more grip. It was agreed to investigate this.

## **Good Neighbours Scheme**

It was reported that the Jubilee party at the Village Hall went well and a quiz night will be held at the Social Club on 18th June.

## **Community Improvement Fund**

The hanging baskets will be coming soon. In the future we will need to look at installing troughs under the gates, as we may have less and less suitable lamp posts to install baskets.



## **Parish Trees**

The Parish Council has received a request from St Andrew's Church for the removal of some trees from St Andrew's Churchyard, along with a quotation for the work. The Parish Council has a legal responsibility to maintain the Churchyard. Following a short discussion it was agreed to ask St Andrew's to obtain a second quotation from the Parish Council's Gardening Contractor who has the necessary skills to undertake the work. It was also requested that St Andrew's provide a plan showing which trees they are requesting the Parish Council remove for consideration at the next Parish Council meeting.

## **Policing**

The return of PCSO Laura Tuck to duties was welcomed by the meeting.



The 21<sup>st</sup> anniversary of the beginning of the volunteer project at the Luton Hoo Estate Walled Garden is celebrated this year. It was locally nominated independently for 'The Queen's Award for Voluntary Service 2022' – the highest accolade given to volunteer groups across the UK.



The results of the project can be seen on our Open Wednesdays from **10:30-16:00** until the end of September. Admission price is just **£7.50** which includes a free guided historical garden tour by one of our researchers which will happen on the hour throughout the day. Come for the whole day with time for a tour; for buying produce from the garden including Luton Hoo honey as well as plants, seasonal fruit and vegetables and cut flowers; and time for that all important refreshment break or two from our Woodyard cafe in the Shooting Lodge which is accessed via our picturesque woodland walk.

Not just for adults: under 5's can come for **free** to enjoy the open spaces and even babies can enjoy the flowers. For older children there are workshops during the summer holidays (August 4th, 11th, 18th, 25th) and the popular **Bug Hunt** is on **Friday 19th August** see website for more details.

Other events ; The National Garden Scheme Open Day is on Friday 5th August, a study day on 12th October looking back on our 21 years of volunteering and an Autumn Open Day 26th October. ## Message from St Andrew's

Do you think of the school holidays as a time for rest and relaxation? My boys are grown up now but I do remember having mixed feelings about the holidays. Yes, a rest from the daily commute to school, but oh the complexities of finding fun activities. I even had a spreadsheet to keep track. When I was in paid work I found that the effort needed to prepare for a break and then pick up all the pieces afterwards made the holiday barely worth it.

Whatever our home circumstances, all of us need times of rest and refreshment. There are lots of words of wisdom in the Bible about the need for rest. Indeed it is built into the story of creation: in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, and on the seventh day he rested and was refreshed. [No, I don't mean it literally, think of it as poetry not documentary.]

The promise of rest appears in the popular Psalm 23: **“He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He refreshes my soul.”**

Refreshment means to be given new strength or energy, like being poured a cool drink on a hot day. As Christians, we also think of refreshment as being spiritually energised.

We may not be in a position to find that rest on a Summer holiday, but hopefully each of us can find a little bit of time each day to set aside our concerns and find some peace. Perhaps you might want to say this simple prayer:

*Lord God, I want to follow your example of work and rest that helps me recover. Give me wisdom to review my daily routines and see where I am not getting enough rest to be refreshed, and where I am not allowing others to unplug and be revived. You made rest for a reason — so I can be refreshed in mind, body, and soul. Help me to take time off whether it is from work, school, housework or caring responsibilities. Amen.*

## Gardening Notes *by Russell Sprout*

As I write this we are enjoying some warm sunny weather but are desperate for some rain after an unusually dry April, never happy are we! Just hope when we get some it knows when to stop.

Gladioli will not need staking for normal garden use but keep well watered and weed free. Irises can be divided and replanted this month and cut the top half of the leaves off to avoid wind damage. July is the month when lilies are at their best and unless you want to save the seed they should be deadheaded as the flowers fade, water carnations and pinks if the weather is dry. Early this month sow Sweet Williams and Wall Flowers for colour in the spring. Rock gardens will look somewhat drab from now until the autumn but best to keep the weeds down to prevent the alpines from being overwhelmed, so keep weeding and trimming alpines and water if necessary. Mounded or carpeting plants not showing new growth should have soil mixture and fertiliser worked into them. Patio containers and hanging baskets will require watering at least once a day and deadhead to keep them looking their best.

Deadhead roses on a regular basis to encourage a second flush in the autumn and keep an eye out for greenfly, black spot, mildew and rust. Tie young stems of Dahlias to their supports with soft string or raffia and if large blooms are required then disbud the lower buds to get long stems for cutting and arranging in a vase. Chrysanthemums can be treated the same way, but spray varieties should be left, although stake and tie-in shoots to avoid wind damage. Prune deciduous shrubs such as Jasmine and Philadelphus after flowering by removing spent flowers and weak shoots.

In the greenhouse tomatoes and cucumbers should be bearing fruit; a liquid fertiliser should be applied every 7-10 days to encourage the fruits to ripen. Blackcurrants can be pruned after fruiting, cutting out the old wood, tie in new shoots of blackberries and loganberries but keep them separate from the fruiting shoots. Summer fruiting raspberries can be cut down as the fruiting canes are finished, but leave the new shoots because they will bear next year's crop. Tidy up the strawberry bed when the fruits are finished.

Complete planting of leeks this month as well as late Brussel sprouts, winter cabbage and spring broccoli, also plant swedes by the middle of the month. Keep pinching out the side shoots of tomato plants (except bush varieties) to get decent size fruits. In the herb garden make further sowings of Chervil, Dill and Parsley and remember to harvest just before they come into full bloom if you are going to dry them for future use.

If the weather is hot and dry and there isn't a hosepipe ban, then water the lawn regularly, aerate by spiking with a fork as this will help the water penetrate well below the surface where it's needed to keep it looking green.
