
Doug will be sadly missed by his former regulars and friends.

Slip End Parish Council Chairmans Report

2021-2022

At the beginning of the year, we were holding meetings using video conferencing due to ongoing Covid restrictions. We were permitted to hold meetings in person, with the necessary social distancing, from June. While the effects of the pandemic will be very long lasting, I think we all feel grateful to be returning to some sort of normality.

Newlands Park Planning

Revised outline planning applications were submitted to Luton Borough Council for the Newlands Park development on land adjacent to the motorway. The previous application was for a development of mainly leisure and retail. The new proposal is predominantly warehousing and distribution units along with a park and ride facility.

Due to the complexities of the application and the large number of issues raised, a special online meeting was held on 11th May to formulate a response to the consultation. The minutes of this meeting and all other Parish Council meetings can be found on our website.

Parish Council, supported by Central Bedfordshire Council, submitted several major concerns regarding the application. The proposal includes the use of Newlands Road which is completely unsuitable for goods vehicles. This is a small road which is already being pushed to capacity by the new Stockwood Gardens development of around 400 flats. Further increases in traffic volume on this road will inevitably result in some vehicles being displaced onto other roads in the Parish, primarily Front Street and Half Moon Lane, Hyde. We also raised questions regarding the park-and-ride facility and the potential for increased parking on already crowded roads within the parish.

Roads

The junction near Harpers in Pepperstock is due to be replaced with a new layout to improve traffic flow and remove confusion as to the correct route.

Several residents have raised concerns about speeding in Summer Street. We have requested a speed survey and once the data from this is received, we will be able to understand if traffic calming measures are necessary. We are also investigating the siting of a speed activated sign on Woodside Road close to the junction with Mancroft Road. Vehicles gather speed as they travel down the hill and residents have indicated that this is causing a dangerous situation.

We have been successful in convincing Central Bedfordshire Council to fund a new gate and sign at Lower Woodside. This will help to maintain its identity within the Parish. Other gate features which have rotted after many years in position have either been replaced or are scheduled to be replaced.

Hanging Baskets

Hanging flower baskets were sited throughout the Parish over the summer of 2021. It was decided to renew the contract for a further period of three years starting in 2022. Councillors all felt that the hanging baskets are a great addition to the appearance of the Villages. The contractor who supplies the baskets will now also be providing the watering service. Unfortunately, we will not be able to position the baskets on the new lampposts installed in the past year. The new posts are hinged to enable easy maintenance and can therefore not hold flower baskets.

Crawley Playground

The playground continues to be well used. A full safety check of the playground equipment is carried out twice a week so any required remedial work can be identified quickly. We have needed to replace more parts than expected and these costs are under constant review. A full clean of the equipment was carried out at the start of the spring.

Gardening

Andy and Debbie Prothero, who have carried out the gardening and playground maintenance for many years, retired at the end of March.

We would like to thank Andy and Debbie for all their hard work and dedication over the years and wish them an enjoyable retirement. Following a tender process, a new three-year contract for gardening and playground maintenance was awarded to Edwin Thrift of Lansdowne Services Ltd.

Flooding

Flooding in Mancroft Road and Grove Road are major concerns. Mancroft Road was subject to serious flooding last winter and Grove Road now floods with only moderate rainfall. When Grove Road floods, the footpath becomes impassable which has serious implications for residents of Woodside who need to visit Slip End on foot. Teams from Central Bedfordshire Council have visited both sites and plans have been drawn up to improve the situation at both locations. We hope that these measures will prove effective.

London Luton Airport

During the year we were consulted on two proposals for the expansion of the airport and the Parish Council has objected to both. Any expansion of the airport has a major impact on the lives of residents with noise and night flights being the biggest nuisance. An expansion of passenger numbers will undoubtedly bring an increase in holiday parking in the Parish and we are actively pursuing details and costs of a residents only parking scheme. There are both pros and cons to these schemes and residents will be fully consulted before any decisions are made.

Fly Tipping

Fly Tipping continues to plague our roads. Contents of cannabis farms and other rubbish is regularly dumped in the area with Woodside Road and Half Moon Lane, Hyde being the worst affected. We are pushing Central Bedfordshire Council to install covert cameras at hot spot areas with the hope this will lead to the prosecution of offenders.

Community Projects Group

At the end of December, the Community Projects Group was wound up. All the projects identified in the Parish Plan have been completed and the committee has achieved its objectives. The grant scheme has been taken over by Parish Council and applications submitted are discussed by the full Council at the April meeting. The Good Neighbour Scheme will continue the good work and any funding needed will be applied for from the Parish Council via an annual grant.

The budget was maintained this year and we would like to thank the Clerk and Cllr Brennan for keeping us on track. I would also like to thank the Ward Councillors, Kevin Collins and Eddie Perry for their support over the past year. A special thank you goes to my fellow Councillors for all their support and advice throughout the year.

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council, the Annual Meeting of the Parish and the latest Parish Council Meeting was held on Monday 9th May in the Village Hall. *(Paul's report on previous pages)*

One Planning Application was discussed this month:

CB/22/00659/FULL – 40 Front Street, Slip End – removal of shed and erection of detached dwelling to the rear.

A number of local Residents attended and gave their opinions on the proposed Application. After a discussion amongst Councillors it was agreed to object to this Application on the basis of:

Inappropriate development within a back garden.

Not in keeping with the appearance and character of the area
Severe reduction in privacy for neighbouring properties
Proposed access is over car parking spaces owned and maintained by other residents

Subsequent to the Meeting the Parish Council was informed by the CBC Planning Officer that the Application has been withdrawn.

Consideration of Grant Applications

The two remaining Grant Applications for this year were discussed:
FoSELS – A Grant of £2,332.94 was approved

Slip End Pre-School – A Grant of £1,500 was approved.

CBC Councillor Update

A discussion was held regarding the possibility of a parking scheme that would discourage use of the village for Airport Parking, particularly in Church Road, Summer Street and Front Street. As an initial step the Parish Council will undertake a survey, possibly via leaflets or an on-line survey. There are many issues to consider, including the possibility that a parking scheme in one area may just move the problem to another part of the

village. The results of the survey would help in the creation of a detailed Proposal that could then be put to Residents for their consideration.

Good Neighbour Scheme

A number of events are being planned:

A Platinum Crowns and Coronets Tea Party will be held at the Village Hall on Wednesday 1st June from 2.30pm to 4.00pm. All Slip End Parish Residents over the age of 18 are welcome.

A GNS Quiz night will be held at the Slip End Social Club on Saturday 18th June for Teams of 4. Sign-in will be at 7.30pm for an 8.00pm start. Tickets cost £10 per person to include a fish and chips, pie and chips or sausage and chips supper. To register your interest and your food choice call or text Peter Russell on 07793 636396.

A fund raising Tombola stall will be run at the Slip End Village Day on Saturday the 9th July.

Community Policing

PC Jack Hollands from the Community Policing Team was invited to this month's meeting. He explained he was responsible for Community Policing in Slip End, Caddington, Hyde, Kensworth, Studham and Whipsnade, He is supported by by a PCSO, Laura Tuck, who will shortly return from maternity leave.

The Parish Council expressed its concerns about incidents of off-road motorcycles and fly tipping (while acknowledging fly tipping was primarily the responsibility of CBC).

PC Hollands said residents should report all non-urgent crime via 101. Though it may appear that no immediate police actions take place, it enables the police to create an intelligence database that helps them build a bigger picture and focus resources most efficiently.



Football Cup Winners!

Slip End Reserves won the North Home Counties Football League Division 2 cup final at Creasey Park Dunstable, beating Luton side Brim & Crown 3-0.

Joe Webb opened the scoring before top scorer Henry Snee added 2 more. The reserves finished runners up in their division, the first team finished 4th in the league and were unfortunately beaten in 2 semi finals.

Message from St Andrew's

Things continue to look more and more like they did before COVID don't they? However, we can't ignore the fact that the pandemic has had a huge impact on our lives and continues to do so as we look to the future. Among many lessons learned over the past two years has been the need to change or renew the way we do things in the many different aspects of our lives. This also applies in the area of faith.

For Christians prayer is a core part of our discipline. As part of the revitalisation of what we do as a church we have been engaged in the annual prayer initiative 'Thy Kingdom Come'. And as a follow up to this we are launching a weekly enquirers course on Wednesday 8th June in the church from 7.30pm, aptly named START!



This is a six-session course designed to help people discover the absolute basics of the Christian faith. No prior knowledge of the Christian faith is assumed and there is a simple

offering that enables you to find out more should you choose to. In a down-to-earth interactive approach, it also allows those with faith to discover new answers and to gain a fresh outlook on what it means to be a Christian. These are the main areas that will be explored in videos, interactive discussion, and Q&A over about an hour.

*What's life all about, where are we going?
Does God exist and what is He like?
Why is the world in such a mess?

Gardening Notes *by Russell Sprout*

As I write this we are enjoying some warm sunny weather but are desperate for some rain after an unusually dry April, just hope when we get some it knows when to stop, never happy are we!

Gladioli will not need staking for normal garden use but keep well watered and weed free. Irises can be divided and replanted this month and cut the top half of the leaves off to avoid wind damage. July is the month when lilies are at their best and unless you want to save the seed they should be deadheaded as the flowers fade. Water carnations and pinks if the weather is dry. Early this month sow Sweet Williams and Wall Flowers for colour in the spring. Rock gardens will look somewhat drab from now until the autumn but best to keep the weeds down to prevent the alpines from being overwhelmed, so keep weeding and trimming alpines and water if necessary. Mounded or carpeting plants not showing new growth should have soil mixture and fertilizer worked into them. Patio containers and hanging baskets will require watering at least once a day and deadhead to keep them looking their best.

Deadhead roses on a regular basis to encourage a second flush in the autumn and keep an eye out for greenfly, black spot, mildew and rust. Tie young stems of Dahlias to their supports with soft string or raffia and if large blooms are required then dis-bud the lower buds to get long stems for cutting and arranging in a vase. Chrysanthemums can be treated the same way, but spray varieties should be left, although stake and tie-in shoots to avoid wind damage. Prune deciduous shrubs such as Jasmine and Philadelphus after flowering by removing spent flowers and weak shoots.

In the greenhouse tomatoes and cucumbers should be bearing fruit; a liquid fertiliser should be applied every 7-10 days to encourage the fruits to ripen. Blackcurrants can be pruned after fruiting, cutting out the old wood, tie in new shoots of blackberries and loganberries but keep them separate from the fruiting shoots. Summer fruiting raspberries can be cut down as the fruiting canes are finished, but leave the new shoots because they will bear next year's crop. Tidy up the strawberry bed when the fruits are finished. Keep pinching out the side shoots of tomato plants (except bush varieties) to get decent size fruits. In the herb garden make further sowings of Chervil, Dill and Parsley and remember to harvest just before they come into full bloom if you are going to dry them for future use.
