Bus Services 230 &232

The PN received an email from Councillor Vicky Malone advising us that the information in the last issue was incorrect. The PN team apologises for this and any distress it may have caused. Slip End Parking

I have received several emails from Slip End residents complaining about notes left under their windscreens, accusing them of not being residents and telling them not to park there. Before leaving such a note, please ensure that it is not a residents vehicle, as those who have contacted the PN feel that they are being made unwelcome and this can cause animosity and ill-feeling.

Tea/Coffee Pod Recycling

Central Bedfordshire Council now operate a weekly Pod collection for Tea/coffee machines, if you have a Tasimo, Nespresso or any machine that takes plastic or aluminium pods they can be left with your bins on collection day. You will need to sign up by going to www.podback.org and follow the instructions. You will then be sent 2 rolls of bags and instructions within 2 to 3 days. The coffee and tea grounds are used as either Bio-Mass for power stations or added to compost and the pods recycled.

Finally let me introduce myself.

I live on Woodside Park and was born in South London in 1954. I am the oldest of 2 boys and 2 girls who still live in South London. Some of you may remember my late mother Eleanor Larsen. In 1979 I left London for a summer season position with Pontin's at their centre at Brean Sands, Weston Super Mere and at the end of the season decided to remain in the Bristol area, so found accommodation, A job working as a delivery driver. In 1987 I was married and separated in 2006, finally divorcing in 2017. In 2007 I upped sticks and moved to Platanes, near Rethymno, Crete, Greece. Where I worked in car hire and returned to the UK in late 2012 due to the economic crisis that hit Greece that year. On my return I became a delivery driver for Ocado and transferred to Human Resources in their Hatfield Head Office. Following retirement, I became a telephone holder for the Slip End Good Neighbours Scheme. I also joined the Caddington Surgery, Patients Participation Group, where I am currently the secretary and now as co-editor of this magazine.

Finally I was born with a very rare genetic condition, which means I have to live on a very Low fat diet of 10 grams of fat per day or less and due to this at the age of 50 I was diagnosed as a Type II Diabetic. At present there are only 126 known sufferers in the UK and around 3000 worldwide with this genetic condition.

Councillors met on Monday 5th February 2024, with a long agenda to get through. Some points for residents to be aware of are:

## **Crawley Playground**

Our approved contractor Edwin Thrift of Lansdowne Services suggested a deep clean of all the equipment and bins ahead of Spring, members agreed. He and his team continue to inspect and tidy the playground on a monthly schedule, with any issues reported to the Clerk.

## **Good Neighbour Scheme**

The two council members reported that they have continued success at Soup & a Sarnie on Tuesdays at The Rising Sun, and they have organised an Easter Tea Party on Wednesday 27th March at the village hall. Their AGM is Friday 22nd March at the Village Hall, details will be available nearer the time.

#### **Summer Planting**

Council have discussed the planting contract going forward, as our 2024 is our last year of our current contract with Plantscape. Central Beds Council are replacing broken streetlamps with hinged ones, which will mean our baskets will no longer be suitable due to weight and maintenance of the lamp posts. Council is considering installing troughs at each of the Parish name signs and asked the Clerk to obtain quotes.

## Fly Tipping

The Chairman reported the large number of fly tips along Woodside Road to her contact at Central Beds Council. He replied that it is a 'Hot Spot' and the Task Force Team responsible for clearing tips visited a few weeks ago to remove 16 (yes, that's right, sixteen!)

separate tips. The next day there were more in their place. The CBC representative drives the area and looks through all tips on the off chance of their being any evidence of names/addresses. I continue to encourage residents to report all tips on FixMyStreet www.fixmystreet as soon as you come across them, thanks.

#### CaSeBuG Report to the Slip End Parish Council

During the previous month, there was a lull in communication whilst Central Bedfordshire Executive Council drew up plans to close the Budget deficit. During this period we were mainly engaged in lobbying to retain the Transport Budget. We are now given to understand that the Transport Budget, previously under threat, has now largely been retained but, the Departmental Budgets have yet to be issued. So no doubt will come under a tight reign.

Hence we feel the time is right to commence dialogue again with the Transport Officers on the proposed improvements to the 232 (231) and 230 services. To that end, we are to meet with Adrian Hardy within the month to discuss possible enhancements to the 230 service.

We will similarly engage with Dave Streeton on the 232 service to see if our enhancement plan can be delivered.



# Message from St Andrew's

#### Janet Lynn Buttery 1946 to 2024



It is with great sadness that I report the passing of Janet on January 22nd. A wonderful wife, mother, grandmother, great grandmother and true friend to all. She bore her cancer diagnosis with great bravery, true belief and quiet determination that it would not beat her.

She was a great inspiration to all who knew her and she will never be forgotten. Jan was born in Somercotes, near Alfreton in Derbyshire in 1946, where she lived happily with her parents before meeting the love of her life Alan in1963. Whilst on a date with one of his friends, he managed to persuade her that he was the one for her when he offered to walk her home from her evening out.

They both worked for Derbyshire County Council and were married in 1967. In 1970 Alan persuaded Jan to move to Luton for 'two years' to work for Luton Borough Council, and if she didn't like it he promised they would return home. This stretched into eight years but Jan always wanted to return. Alan worked for the Engineering Dept and Jan for the Treasurers Dept. However, in October 1978 they moved to Claydown Way, Slip End and she found great happiness there, and loved being part of the village community and made many friends.

Son Matthew, (Matt) was born in 1975, later followed by daughter Rachel in 1979. Whilst the children were little Jan continued to work part-time at Luton Council, then gradually became more involved with village life.

Janet soon joined the Church Family at St Andrew's where she willingly took on anything that was asked of her. She helped me with the Sunday School for many years and we had a lovely group of children, at one time split into four different age groups. In later years Jan became a member of PALS and we visited villagers who had become bereaved or were lonely, or had longterm illnesses. Sadly that came to an end when lockdown appeared. would also help serve the breakfast at Café Church mornings, and at the many Harvest Suppers held at the Village Hall, plus help with many Harvest Festivals and with distributing food parcels.

Friend Liz Higgens started a music group called Themes many years ago that Jan joined, which was a great success. We would sing at various events including singing at the church, and formed great friendships with the other singers. Jan later joined the Chiltern Singers in Dunstable where they would visit Nursing and Care Homes (and Jan would declare she didn't want to end up there!). She was also a member of the Cantata Choir based in Luton and would perform at concerts. We still have a music group at St Andrews, led by Sylvia Harland and perform at occasions throughout the year. Jan really loved her singing and being part of a group.

With good friend Sue Lyons, Jan volunteered at The Childrens Society charity shop in Dunstable for several years which sadly had to close as it wasn't taking enough money.

they had some 'interesting' times'.

Centre in Luton, where divorced or separated parents would arrange to meet their children. She would make the teas and coffees and be a friendly face there. Jan and Sue also worked in a little shop next to the Mental Health Clinic at the Luton & Dunstable hospital serving visitors and patients, when needed.

Jan and Alan helped with Election Duties for approximately twenty years, working at various schools and village halls for the Luton Town Hall office. Several village friends would also go along to help with the 'count' on Voting Day.

There are so many jobs that Jan took on within the village and I hope I have remembered them all. She was Parent Governor at Slip End School, later becoming Chair of Governors and took her role very seriously, helpina improve the school for the children if she could. She would help the younger children with reading and English and could be seen in the Nursery Dept washing their towels weekly.

Jan was a trustee for the Grace Cook Fund, which helped pay for taxi fares to and from hospital for villagers before the Good Neighbour Scheme took over. She was also a phone holder for the GNS and would help at special events in the Village Hall for them, serving teas etc,

Jan was on the Parish Plan committee with me and others, where we met regularly with an advisor, and decided which were the most important factors to improve our village. A survey was taken around the Parish and the final phase was local improvements to the park, which is now used by many families.

Following on from the charity shop, Jan Was a member of the Gardening and Sue worked for the WRVS delivering Club in the village, and loved going along 'Meals on Wheels' around Luton, where to visit other gardens and listen to the speakers at the meetings. She was a Jan also volunteered at the Contact member of the Chatty Club which was started by Lily Ackrill at The Rising Sun, and we had some great times there, especially the Christmas dinners. It is great to see that its still up and running at the pub where it first started.

> She was proof-reader for the Parish News for many years which I was very grateful for when Editor. I only hope she doesn't spot too many mistakes in my tribute to her.

> Jan also became involved with Operation Christmas Child and would help me with all the shoeboxes collected at church, and also with checking the boxes. Jan's faith was very important to her and she attended Church regularly with her many friends. We will all miss her and her firm beliefs greatly. It will never be the same.

> 'It broke our hearts to lose you, but you didn't ao alone.

> For part of us went with you, the day God took you home'

# Gardening Notes by Russell Sprout

As the days start to lengthen and the weather improves so the garden beckons once again, and I am sure it will be a relief to everyone to be able to get outside again and get on with jobs in the garden.

Plant roses early in the month and prune established plants during a frost free period, cutting out all dead wood and any branches crisscrossing to open up and shape the bush to a bowl shape. Don't be afraid of cutting a rose back too far as they benefit from a really good reduction of the previous year's growth to produce strong new shoots.

Dahlias and chrysanthemums over-wintered in the greenhouse will have shoots on them by now and cuttings can be taken when they are approximately 3 inches long. Gladioli corms can be planted later this month and if sown over the next 6 weeks will give a longer flowering season. Sow between 4-6 inches deep and you will avoid the need of staking them. Sweet peas which were sown in autumn and over-wintered in pots or brought from a nursery will need to be planted out as soon as the weather permits. They make an effective display when grown in clumps and supported with pea sticks or a cylinder of netting. If you have any large clumps of snowdrops they can be dug up and split into small bunches and replanted straight away, but should only be done about every fifth year.

Tomatoes sown last month under heat will need pricking out now or they will become weak and spindly. Finish pruning established fruit trees and bushes as soon as possible in the month.

Main crop brussel sprouts can be sown early in the month in drills  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch deep for planting out at the end of April. Parnsips can also go in as soon as the soil is dry in drills  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch deep and 15 inches apart, if you sow 3 seeds at 6 inch spacings this will make it a lot easier when it comes to thinning out.

Onion sets can be planted towards the end of the month or early next month, but shallots should be planted as soon as possible if not already done. Leeks can be sown this month for transplanting in June and summer spinach sown this month will be ready in May/June. Sow early rounded peas and broad beans until mid month. Early potatoes can be planted from the middle of the month 9-12 inches deep and 14 inches apart, but as they shoot above ground they will need to be protected from frost.

Lawns will need some attention after the rigors of winter, new lawns need a final raking of ground dug in the autumn to a fine tilth for sowing seed. Established lawns will benefit from a good scarifying with a lawn rake or an electric scarifier to remove dead grass, moss and thatch. Any worn areas can be reseeded and any sunken areas levelled and seeded to bring it back to a good condition for the year ahead. The first time you cut don't cut too short, lower the blades over the next few mowings. Trim and straighten edges angling the cut slightly away from you to avoid it crumbling away.

Finally, the Gardening Club are planning to hold their Open Gardens event this year and would like to hear from you if you are interested in opening your garden, the date is Saturday 29th June. It's not a competition, it's just a fun day sharing your garden with other people and helping the Gardening Club to raise funds. 

They can deal with Ear, Nose and Throat problems. Three types of skin problems and Urinary Tract Infections (See poster opposite). Any local pharmacy can be used.

NOTE: Usual prescription charges apply.

It was explained that the online Triage was a live system in that as soon as the duty bdoctor had dealt with the item in front of him, the system reset itself and is again live. If the system tells you that it is full, give the system a short time and try again.


