PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The latest Parish Council Meeting was held on Monday 5th July in the Village Hall.

Two Planning Applications were discussed this month:

1. **CB/21/02405/FULL** --10 Summer Street, Slip End – Single Storey Side Extension.

After a short discussion, it was agreed to submit a “No Objection” comment to CBC Planning.

2. **CB/21/02845/VOC** - 98 Markyate Road, Slip End, Luton, LU1 4BX - Variation of condition. To change the design by way of a single storey rear addition and front roof dormer windows.

After a short discussion, it was agreed to submit a “No Objection” comment to CBC Planning.

Crawley Playground and Youth Shelter

The Parish Council pays for regular ROSPA safety inspections and the latest Inspection Report has come through and there were no serious issues.

Graffiti in the Youth Shelter should have been removed by the time you read this.

There has been an increase in litter in the playground recently. Residents are kindly asked to put all their litter in a bin or take it home with them for disposal.

A man seen hanging around the Youth Shelter had been reported to the Police and was being investigated. At the time of writing we have no more information about this.

Hanging Baskets

The initial 3 year contract for the Hanging Baskets is now up for renewal. It was agreed we would continue with this initiative and would seek prices for a further 3 years. Parish Councillors were satisfied with the service provided by the existing supplier and would continue with them providing any price increases were in line with inflation. Some possible new locations may be added.



Fly Tipping

CBC has now received new covert cameras and is working through the legal formalities. We are awaiting feedback on their use at our fly tipping hotspots.

Summer Street Speeding

The Parish Council recently asked (via Parish News and the Parish Facebook page) whether residents in Summer Street would be interested in the possibility of speed calming measures e.g. speed humps. The Parish Council received four replies; one in favour, three said it was not an issue. It was agreed that because of the lack of residents support this matter will not be pursued further.

Due to an increase in staff needing to self-isolate due to COVID-19 and a national shortage of qualified waste vehicle drivers, we are experiencing severe staff shortages. We do not anticipate this service resuming in August, due to ongoing and significant LGV driver shortages.

So that we can prioritise resources to maintain critical household waste collections such as clinical waste, residual waste (black bin) and dry recycling, all kerbside collections of household garden waste across all of Central Bedfordshire are suspended until further notice.

We have been working with our contractors FCC to increase efforts to stabilise crew numbers, to reduce the strain being caused, and we will update this webpage if the situation changes.

We apologise for any inconvenience caused, please bear with us at this difficult time.

Alternative ways to dispose of garden waste

There are a number of other ways to dispose of your garden waste during these disruptions.

Household Waste Recycling Centres (Tidy Tips)

We have four tidy tips open, seven days a week and we have added more appointment slots to help with increased demand.

Home composting

Residents with enough space in their gardens are encouraged to home compost. Home composting is a good way to dispose of and reuse your garden waste. It's also a great way to help the environment and it can save you trips to the tip.

Beware of possible scammers

Please be aware that if you receive calls or emails from a company/individual claiming the council have instructed them to contact residents and arrange collections of missed garden waste (or any other waste), these are not associated with Central Bedfordshire Council.





As many of you know I like to help raise money for Keech Hospice Care.. On Saturday 2nd of May 2020 I was due to do a wing walk. Due to Covid it got postponed but on this original date my husband took a few photos of my upcoming stunt in our back garden

Eventually the wing walk got rebooked for the **Saturday 3rd of July 2021**. The weather forecast was not looking good, even on the day travelling to Damyns Hall Aerodrome in Essex the weather was getting greyer and wetter the nearer we got.

There were six of us doing the wing walk for Keech, and I was 3rd to go. Some of my family came to watch and support me and they were very proud of me even though they thought me crazy and bonkers for doing such a thing!



We had a 10 minute briefing to go over all the safety aspects etcetera. We were told on a clear day that we would be able to see the Thames, the Queen Elizabeth Bridge and some of the iconic buildings in London..... but unfortunately it was still a little bit cloudy, but at least the rain had stopped. I had to nerves or fear and was looking forward to going up. I climbed safely up onto the wing where I was strapped in with a five point belt done up nice and tight and I was given a set of earplugs.

It took a good few minutes to taxi to the runway, lots of waving and smiles to my family. The takeoff was very smooth and soon I was able to see the beautiful golf club course below and wave to dog walkers. Even though it was a bit of a grey day it was not cold so there was no need for a hat or gloves, which made it very free and pleasant. The first five minutes were sightseeing criss-crossing over the runway, but the second half was more the rollercoasters experience- so twists and turns, nose dives and acceleration upward! it was quite thrilling but I have to say it went on a little bit longer than I would've liked! At the briefing we had been given hand signals to give to our pilot if we were uncomfortable, and either wanted him to stop doing the rollercoasters moves or even if we wanted to land immediately, but I did not use these as I kept thinking it can't be much longer! We had a lovely smooth landing and happily I stepped down from the plane with no wobbly legs....but my tummy was still up in the air! After about half an hour I was able to eat something whilst looking at the photos that my siblings had taken. We stayed and watched one other to complete her wing walk and then we made our way home.

I have done a little display of my photos in the window of my Salon along with keeping my sponsorship form at the ready to continue to raise money for Keech. As it stands at the moment I have reached **£2000**, and will be sending this off to the hospice soon. Because of the delay from doing it last year, many of my friends and family had already paid upfront, so I sent **£1000** off to Keech last summer, as their need was greater than mine in these Covid times. Gardening Notes

A difficult year for gardeners this year with a prolonged cold wet spring and little sunshine. Nevertheless, most plants seem to have coped with it quite well and the roses this year have been stunning. Now as summer fades into autumn and the days start to shorten early morning frosts are likely towards the end of the month, so beware.

Keep dead-heading roses, cuttings can be taken now, about 12" long, remove all the thorns and trim top and bottom leaving just the upper pair of leaves and insert into the soil so that the lowest leaf is just above the soil, these will take about a year to root and be ready to transplant. New growth on climbers should be tied in to stop them from getting damaged by the wind, but make ties loose enough to allow for the thickening of the stems as they develop.

As annuals start to fade remove them so that spring bedding plants can be planted towards the end of the month, such as Wallflowers, Polyanthus, Forget-Me-Nots and Sweet Williams. Bulbs such as daffodils, hyacinths, tulips and crocuses can also be planted at the same time. If you have grown large type dahlias or chrysanthemums it would be a good idea to stake them to stop the wind breaking them and if cutting for the vase do it when the blooms are well opened. If you intend to take cuttings from the root stock of chrysanthemums it is a good idea to label them whilst you can tell what colours they are, or like me you will forget and have to go for pot luck next year! Gladioli corms should be left in the ground to mature until next month, although the tops may turn brown.

Towards the end of the month alpinas can be replanted and this month is a good time to make a rockery. Make sure it is free draining and will not become too wet, as the plants will rot, so make sure there is plenty of rubble as a base and finer rubble as a top layer.

Harvest soft fruit as it ripens and when they have finished fruiting cut out all the old wood and tie in the new shoots. Spring cabbages can be planted out towards the end of the month, plant close together in the rows and as they get going in the spring pull every other one out and use as leaf greens and leave the others to mature and heart up. Apples and pears can be stored if you cannot use them all right now, but make sure the stalk is attached to the fruit (otherwise they will not store well) and the fruit has no blemishes. Wrap them individually in paper and place in a cool, dark, dry place such as a shed, but watch out for mice or they will eat them before you do! Check once a week for any that need discarding or using. Remove any shading from greenhouses as the plants will require more light and the sun starts to lose it's fierce heat.

Sadly our allotments will be closing at the end of the month (see page 3 for details).



SLIP END COMMUNITY YARD SALE


Saturday 7th August saw the first ever Slip End Community Yard Sale in the Village, brilliantly organised by Karen Bracey.

We are at the beginning of a long-term partnership where novel fertilisers will be assessed for their ability to meet the nutrient demand of winter wheat and winter barley in a fully randomised and replicated crop trial’.

We are still on a recruitment drive and are looking for gardeners in different roles including plant preparation, floristry, soft fruit, etc and for other volunteers in other parts of the enterprise including genealogists.

We hope to have an Autumn Open Day with children’s events in the October half term – please check the website for confirmation. Next year is the 21st anniversary of the beginning of the project and there is already a fascinating timeline in a display in the vinery.

A Message from St Andrew's

As I write, thoughts concerning zeal and resilience come to me after reading Romans 10.1-4. But first, some background on how St Andrew's is negotiating our new circumstances of 'COVID freedom'. We have all been eager to resume a greater degree of 'normality'. As legal restrictions were lifted, St Andrew's responded in line with Church of England guidance. The emphasis was on the responsibility to continue protecting ourselves and others. After a review, some relaxation of measures was agreed as was the retention of a number of existing precautions.

We are delighted that congregational singing is back (albeit with face coverings) as are after-service refreshments, crèche areas for young children and normal seating. Precautions that we've retained include recommending face coverings, a separate socially-distanced seating area and Holy Communion in one kind. We continue providing a zoom link for those unable to attend in person.

Returning to Romans 10, Paul criticises the Jews for a zeal that is '*not based on knowledge*'. Zeal is strength and vitality for sustaining a course of action. The Jews were zealous for the law but did not know the righteousness of God in the gospel. We might ask ourselves, are we being observant in the knowledge and guidance received during the pandemic? The idea of zeal is related to another more frequently used word –resilience; a capacity for recovery from difficulty.

A crisis has the effect of putting individuals to the test. Each person has the opportunity to gain and apply knowledge and resilience. We have available a range of new 'knowledge' that can foster zeal and resilience in the pandemic. Personal resilience in the age of COVID is promoted for example by maintaining adequate nourishment and sleep, being mindful of our thoughts and feelings and staying active and connected with others. We thank God for specialist help available to those struggling and suffering pandemic fatigue and signs such as poor mental health.

Additionally, just as for the Jews, Paul points out that we have received saving knowledge if we have heard the gospel of Christ, and he adds, *if you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved* (Romans 10.9). May we all find safety and resilience based on knowledge that has come to us.


Photography Group


We are still taking photos for a monthly topic. July's topic was Wild Flowers and the one for the end of August was chosen as "Statues".

Information about Flowers in the Churchyard at St Andrew's

The Churchyard Regulations 2020 were updated in July 2021. Amongst many other things they deal with flowers on graves and memorials. This is what they mean for our churchyard.

Fresh flowers are encouraged as the symbol of the gift of creation and the brevity of life. Bulbs are similarly encouraged as a symbol of resurrection. Silk flowers are only permitted in exceptional circumstances.

At St Andrew's we acknowledge that silk flowers can look beautiful and are therefore permitted, especially as our churchyard is visited by rabbits, squirrels and muntjac that sometimes eat fresh flowers.

Our churchwardens remove dead flowers or artificial flowers that have deteriorated to keep the churchyard tidy.

The planting of perennial flowering plants, shrubs or trees (including conifers) is not permitted. as they impede the maintenance of the churchyard. A growing shrub or tree roots will disturb the grave and may eventually damage the memorial stone or an adjacent grave.

Families may wish to donate money for a rose bush to be planted in the beds at the front of the church. These will be labelled with the name of the loved one. Speak to Susan Wiltshire if this would be of interest (01582 727000).


